I write on behalf of the Home Care Association of New York State (HCA), our providers, health plans, professional health leaders, and the more than 500,000 patients and families we serve across the state, as we prepare for our upcoming work with you in the 2019 state legislative and budget session.

I thank all current legislative members for the strong and steadfast support you've given to home care recipients in your districts, including support for our member organizations that provide this service. I look forward to further working together, and I also look forward to meeting with incoming legislative members as we approach a new policy year. HCA is eager to be your resource for technical assistance and proposals to shape effective state health policy.

To reinforce this role, our organization is planning a January 8 informational session on home care, hospice and managed long term care for all legislative staff. The extraordinarily committed individuals in this field carry out vital health and support roles for patients across the entire spectrum of care – from pregnancy and newborn care, to post-acute recovery care, to chronic disease management, and palliative or end-of-life care.

New York has long been respected as the nation's pioneer and innovator in home and community based health care, and HCA's state professionals, Board of Directors and affiliates are national leaders in this work. We look forward to assisting you.

This past month, you may have seen our recent outreach to your offices in celebration of National Home Care Month, a commemoration that continues into December. Now, and

throughout the year, we are delighted to assist your offices in building on this celebration by connecting you with local resources or agency leaders and community health professionals on home care and hospice, arranging home visits to meet your constituents receiving home care and hospice, or media opportunities.

Thank you and best wishes to you, your staff and families as we approach the coming holidays.

We look forward to the upcoming service and policy opportunities together.
