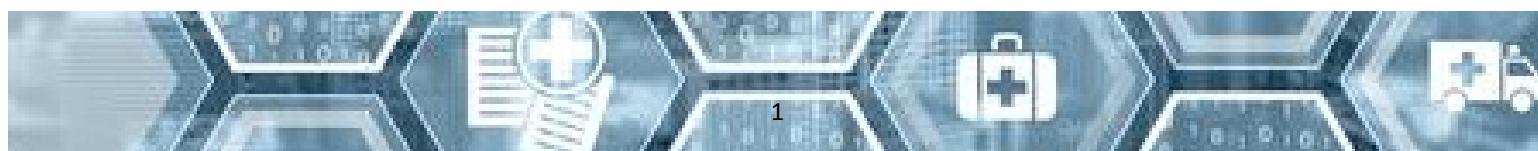

Home Health Care Clinical Managers/Supervisors of Clinical Services, Quality Management staff and Clinical Educators will play a key role in the successful implementation of the new Medicare Patient Driven Groupings Model (PDGM). - Create an initial action plan for successful PDGM implementation



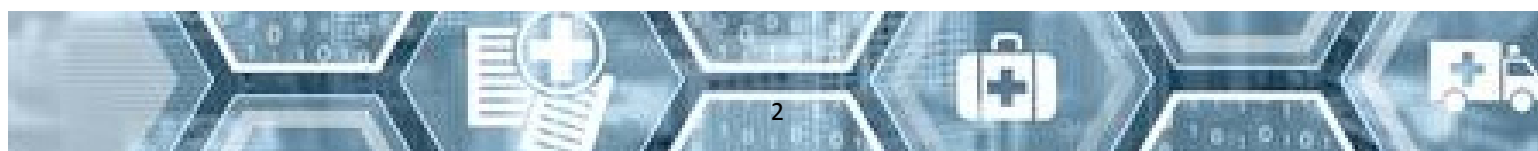
About the Presenter
