What is the Workforce Investment Program?

The Workforce Investment Program is a joint New York State and federally funded initiative designed to attract, recruit, retain and retrain healthcare workers to serve the long term sector. The training is being conducted by eight Workforce Investment Organizations (WIOs) across the State. Montefiore's WIO has been designated to serve long term care providers in New York City and the Hudson Valley.

Montefiore WIO Goals

- Improve the quality of care delivered to individuals needing long term care
- Support the professional development of long term care workers by increasing their skills and knowledge
- Avoid unnecessary hospitalizations and visits to the emergency department
- Enhance the effectiveness of the entire health care team by more effectively incorporating information provided by long term care workers

Overview

There are five courses in the Montefiore WIO Professional Development Series. They are:

- Part I: Population Health and Care Coordination Basics
- Part II: Communication Skills
- Part III: Chronic Care Medical Management
- Part IV: Behavioral Health Care Management
- Part V: Improving Patient Care through Data Collection

Courses can be taken as a series, individually or in any preferred combination.




Each course has its own objectives and supporting materials and activities. Because active participation of learners in the training is key toward reaching learning goals, course activities include self-surveys, videos, interactive games

and role plays. Case studies that simulate situations that reflect the long term care population's medical and behavioral conditions, as well as their social and economic challenges, are used to facilitate skill development.

Each course includes an introduction and summary with a review of all handouts. Pre- and post-assessments and course evaluations are used to measure how well the learner understands the content.

Target Audience

The direct care workforce is vital to the successful transformation of health care from the institutional to the community setting. Long-term health care workers play a vital role in knowing their patients and the patient's goals and are well-positioned to serve as the eyes and ears of the health care team, ensuring patients receive the right care, at the right time, in the right setting.



Montefiore WIO offers training to a broad cross-section of long term care workers including Home Health Aides (HHAs), Personal Care Assistants (PCAs) and Certified Nurse Assistants (CNAs). Montefiore also provides recruitment and retention services focused on improving the skills of the workers to enable them to provide high quality patient care.

Part I: Population Health and Care Coordination Basics



Understanding the importance of population health, care coordination, cultural competence, and health literacy is key when promoting health and wellness, and advocating for patients/residents. This course guides long term health care workers on how

Part II: Communication Skills

Effective communication skills are needed to speak clearly and appropriately and to build and maintain trusting relationships with patients, their families and co-workers. This course guides long term healthcare workers on effective and respectful communications with patients, their families and other members of the healthcare team. Participants learn techniques such as motivational interviewing, brief action planning, SBAR and the use of INTERACT tools to foster patient-centered decision-making.

Part III: Chronic Care Medical Management



Understanding chronic health conditions and the appropriate actions required to assist patients and family members are vital to improving quality of care and enhancing quality of life. This course identifies essential steps in recognizing and

reporting early changes in medical conditions in older adults. Participants learn to recognize “Red Flags,” signs and symptoms of a change in conditions, and learn the appropriate interventions.





Case Management Certification Preparation

This course provides the content that case managers need to prepare for the Case Management Certification (CCM) exam and the ACM and ANCC CM certifications. It is also appropriate for interdisciplinary professionals who want a basic course in case management practice.

Participants receive a 300-page course manual that is updated every four months. The manual includes:

- The domains of essential case management knowledge per national standards and the CCM Commission
- Overview of the CCM process and exam
- 130+ sample questions
- Self-assessment design
- Resources for self-study
